In the years that I have been coming to UBC, I have heard and met some of the missionaries that we support. Last month I finally got the opportunity with Pastor Nick, Elder Doug, and Cathy Mitchum to go and visit some of these missionaries and see the work that they do.

We learned from and experienced the ministry of three amazing couples who are still part of the UBC family although they are on the other side of the world. Jim and Judy Larson serve in Bangkok, Thailand; Ross and Shirley Mackin serve in Korat Village in Thailand, and Kreg and Jenny Mallow who serve in the Ratanakari province in Cambodia.

We did a lot in two weeks. We visited a slum and prayed with people in need, heard a powerful redemptive story from volunteers, did outreach in Chinatown, helped with a medical clinic distributing reading glasses, visited an elementary school, shared the Gospel, led crafts and played games with children, led classes with church members, worshipped with a youth group, shared

testimonies, attended an expatriate fellowship, and attended church.

It was an absolute blessing to spend time with, get to know, and experience the work of these missionaries have dedicated their lives to. I was constantly reminded of what a blessing it is to be able to worship our God openly, how God often transforms and uses people, and how life as a believer is not always linear, but God is there every step of the way. What a joy it is to know Jesus. Southeast Asia will forever remain in my heart and prayers.
